FIT YOUR SCHEDULE

King Graduate School offers working adults flexible options to earn their graduate degree while maintaining their professional and personal commitments. Students pursuing their Master's in Business Administration, Criminal Justice, Hospitality* and Public Health have the option of taking classes completely online, while students in every program can combine online classes with in-person courses just two nights a week or on Saturdays.

King Graduate School's network of personal and academic support extends to all students, ensuring that those completing their degree online have access to the same resources, staff, and faculty as those studying on campus.

*The MS in Hospitality Management program is a one-year program that requires a two-week residency on the New Rochelle campus at the beginning and end of the program.

Graduate Soomer: The King Graduate School employs a three-semester academic calendar, allowing graduate students to complete their degrees in less time. Most of our degree programs can be completed in as little as 16 months.

RESEARCH

As practitioners, our professors bring a wealth of knowledge to the classroom — including their field experience, research methods, and best practices. Our faculty is actively engaged in applied research and community engagement projects, seeking solutions for the problems faced by communities in the U.S. and beyond. Our professors' concentrations and recent research include:

- + **Dr. Mariceli Comellas (MPH)** focused on patient caregiving, glycemic control, and the health outcomes for patients with Type 2 diabetes and cardiovascular disease. Her work has been published in *American Journal of Cardiology, Journal of Cardiovascular Nursing*, and *The Diabetes Educator*.
- + Dr. Devindranauth Rawana (MBA) concentrated his primary research on economic development for immigrant and low-income communities in urban areas. His recent work focuses on the New York City Housing Authority in the South Bronx.
- + **Dr. William Vericker (MSCJ)** presented his research on alcoholism and drug addiction at an American Conference for Irish Studies National Meeting. The paper, which examined the connections among multigenerational oppression, alcoholism, and addiction, forms the basis of his current work developing a curriculum for multiple DWI offenders mandated to treatment at a facility in Westchester County.



ACCOUNTING

36 CREDIT PROGRAM

Our Master of Science in Accounting prepares the next generation of leaders for one of the most important professions in business. With heightened demand from employers for accounting professionals with advanced expertise, the MS in Accounting program is designed to qualify students for employment as public accountants, corporate accountants, and for managerial and leadership positions in private industry, government, and non-profit organizations.

Preparation for the CPA exams is fully integrated into our courses. We also partner with the leading CPA preparation provider to supplement classroom learning with test-taking strategy.

Students who complete this program will be qualified for employment as technology managers, security specialists, database administrators, and software engineers, among other roles, across a wide variety of industry sectors.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

37 CREDIT PROGRAM

Our Master's in Criminal Justice is an interdisciplinary program that prepares students for leadership positions at federal, state, and city agencies. Offering a global perspective on terrorism and other forms of transnational crimes, the program enhances students' understanding of causes of crime as well as the legal, justice, and correctional systems. The program also develops students' competencies in research methods, crime reduction strategies, and analysis of police and court systems.

Students may specialize in Human Services or Urban Crime Policy. Our Human Services concentration includes courses in crisis management, community violence, and urban poverty to prepare students to serve clients in a variety of public outreach organizations. The Urban Crime Policy concentration features courses in New York City's crime population, organized crime, and cybercrime - an ideal focus of study for students looking to work in urban centers as police and prison officers, community managers, and more.

Students learn from professors with real-world experience as hotel and restaurant managers, hospitality executives, and travel professionals. During this program, students will gain a solid understanding in the economics of tourism, hospitality management information systems, strategic management and leadership, qualitative research applications, and more. This program also features a two-week residency on the New Rochelle campus (one at the beginning and one at the end of the program). This enables students to build relationships, share information, and gain valuable experience in the industry.




CORPORATE PARTNERSHIPS
