They can also present at local, regional, and national honors conferences, gaining opportunities to travel across the country!

HONORS COURSES

Students in the Honors Program have access to a broad range of amazing courses.

THE HONORS EXPERIENCE. An

interdisciplinary examination of art, science, social issues, history, and more. This course introduces students to the "honors" way of thinking and writing.

DECADES: A CULTURAL EXPLORATION.

Travel back in time and study a decade through the lens of music, history, politics, and social change.

DECODING SECRET MESSAGES THROUGH

MEDIA. There are hidden messages all around us. Study encryption and decryption to communicate like a pro.

THE ART AND CULTURE OF WORLD

DANCE. Learn about the influence of music and dance on national culture and identity and bring your dancing shoes!!

THE WORLD OF MODERN ART. Understand some of the major influences on famous artists and their work. Follow in their footsteps by putting paint to canvas yourself.

INTRODUCTION TO ETHICS. An

interdisciplinary study of ethical theorems in everything from science and medicine to criminal justice and sports management.

THE AMERICAN PRESIDENCY. Analyze how social, political, cultural, and historical influences affected the decisions and actions of various American presidents.

HUMAN RIGHTS MOVEMENTS IN HISTORY.

By critically examining human rights atrocities throughout history, understand political, economic, and societal factors and consequences. Empower yourself to be an advocate for social justice.

CONTEMPORARY LITERARY GENRES.

Engage in an in-depth exploration of a particular literary genre. Learn how it was developed and examine its richness and impact.

WORLD-CHANGING DISCOVERIES. This course looks at the "game changers" of technology, starting with fire and leading up to modern day innovations like 3D printing.

COMPARATIVE URBANISM. Visit several major U.S. cities to study first-hand how historical, social, and political influences had an impact on their culture, evolution, and infrastructure.

HONORS PROGRAM RESEARCH SEMINAR.

Never look at research the same again. Construct a research proposal and write a literature review, both essential skills for graduate school!

COURSE CLOSE-UP HIP HOP: ORIGINS, CULTURE & SOUL

This course introduces students to the multifaceted world of hip hop. Hip Hop has a rich history, and students will start with the birth of this dynamic genre of music. The emergence and evolution of subsequent Hip Hop culture are examined. The influences of Hip Hop are embedded in many historical and cultural events, including the emergence of Afro-American people and black solidarity movements, both in terms of the cultural roots and routes of Afro-Latino, Caribbean, and indigenous influences on African American expressions.
