The demand for community health professionals has soared in recent years. Reasons for this surge include widening community health concerns, such as natural disasters, potential terrorist attacks, COVID-19, tuberculosis, and other infectious diseases. Additionally, the increased prevalence of chronic diseases due to obesity and an aging population, along with the ongoing desire to address substance abuse and the diseases it causes, have all contributed to gaps in community workers. These fields require hands-on support from individuals who can recognize health problems and implement community programs.

Our community health program uses project-based learning in the classroom to allow students to actively participate in the learning process and apply their critical-thinking skills. The students are trained to promote lifestyle behavior changes that enhance overall health and reduce the burden of preventable, chronic, and infectious diseases in communities. The program aims to prepare high-quality professionals for employment in various settings such as communities, schools, healthcare organizations, colleges/universities, health insurance organizations, and businesses.

SURGICAL TECHNOLOGY

Degree Type: **Associate Degree**



Surgical Technology is a dynamic and rewarding career in the health professions. The surgical technologist combines the knowledge of human anatomy and physiology, with expertise in the theory and application of aseptic techniques, instrumentation, and surgical procedures. They work with highly technical equipment and assist with every type of invasive, therapeutic, and diagnostic procedure. The technologist functions under the supervision of a surgeon and is a vital member of the health care team that is responsible for ensuring the equipment is functioning properly and the operative procedure is conducted under conditions that maximize patient safety. Additionally, they supervise the placement, care, and utilization of all instruments.

Employment of Surgical Technologists is projected by the Bureau of Labor Statistics to grow 9% from 2018 – 2028 which is faster than the average for all occupations. Surgical Technology is one of the fastest-growing careers in health care services, with above average earning potential.

The Surgical Technology program is offered on the New Rochelle campus only. The program is a full-time day program.

Monroe University's education programs develop effective educators, including classroom teachers and other school professionals, to succeed in diverse student populations and community environments. The curriculum focuses on how people learn and how to teach, as well as curriculum development and instructional methods. Coursework emphasizes the latest methods for promoting early childhood development and childhood reading, writing, critical thinking, and problem solving. Classes are small and collaborative with personalized attention from faculty.

Students gain over 600 hours of field experience through partnerships with local public and charter schools, preparing them to become effective teachers and pass the New York State teacher exams leading to certification. Many of our projects and educational opportunities also directly impact our city, students, and educators through deep ties to the local community.

- + After graduation, alumni are invited back for symposiums led by Monroe faculty. These seminars serve to provide graduates with additional mentoring and a support system early in their career.
