The Advanced Certificate in Bilingual Education provides licensed teachers who have previously completed master's level study in classroom instruction (K-12) with the opportunity to expand their study to include the ability to provide instruction for Emergent Bilingual Students (EBLs) in English and Spanish. Bilingual competency is required as part of the Admissions process.

This 15-credit Bilingual Extension combines coursework and fieldwork taught in both English and Spanish. Fully online courses are offered over two semesters of full-time study, or students may decide to study part-time. Certificate holders will gain an understanding of the challenges EBLs face, developing pedagogical skills and instructional strategies to support EBL literacy and content development in English and Spanish, and will be eligible to earn New York State Certification as a Bilingual Educator in the grade bands of their current New York State License.

The Advanced Certificate in Bilingual Education (K-12) is a 15-credit program consisting of five (5) 3-credit courses. A suggested path for full-time study follows.
